Pre-school, Nursery & Reception



Nursery and Pre-School

In Nursery and Pre-school this half term our topic has been Dinosaurs. We have explored pre-historic worlds, written our own stories about unusual pets and become archeologists digging up dinosaur bones.

In maths we have been looking at and creating repeating patterns and exploring

numbers 7.8.9 and 10.

We have been practicing writing our names daily, mark making and developing our fine motor skills by using tweezers and scissors.

In Pre-school we have welcomed new friends, developed out turn taking skills. through playing games and gained more confidence using the outdoor equipment.



















<u>Reception</u>

Reception have had a very interesting and magical Spring term. Our topic has been 'Once Upon a Time' and we have had lots of fantastic experiences!

From dragons flying in the classroom, giants leaving their grubby clothes, enemies trying to attack castles, 6 fantasy doors magically appearing and we can't wait to attend the ball that we have been invited to. We have also been learning about the life cycles of humans, butterflies and frogs. We were very excited to receive a delivery of caterpillars, we have named them Coconut, Candy, Crunchie, Buzz Buzz and Bertie. We have been eagerly checking on them to observe the stages of metamorphosis. The children can now categorize some animals into oviparous or viviparous animals, understanding which animals lay eggs or give birth to their live young.

Years 1 & 2



This half term, we have been learning all about Down Under and Beyond. We have been writing about visiting the Great Barrier Reef and Townsville in Australia.





We have enjoyed getting back into the woods this half term, we have been using natural materials to create kites mobiles and games.









We also designed and made healthy fruit kebabs focusing on cutting skills.







Next half term, we are learning all about the world around us in 'Where in the world'.



Years 3 & 4



This term our topic has been Rivers and The Water Cycle. It saw the children create models of rivers - labelling each part. We wrote narratives based on a river adventure with a boat travelling down the river.



We carried out a Poetry Post walk sending out Quatrain poems to the local community and received some fabulous cards and letters back.



As part of our Rivers topic we had visits from Farrans about the Gull Wing bridge to update us on how the work was coming on. We also had the Flood Risk Management team at the council come in too to tell us about the Tidal Barrier that will be installed in our town in the future. We recreated the length of the barrier but there was not enough of us - that's how large it will be!









We enjoyed the travelling theatre performance all about Climate Change—we especially liked their variety of puppets!

A fab term had by all-have an excellent Easter break.



Years 5 & 6



This term in Year 5 and 6 we have been looking at the Alpine regions in Geography. In Literacy sessions we wrote "nonsense" explanation texts and practiced our oracy skills by sharing them with an audience. Science we have looked at forces and carried out different experiments within these lessons.







The Marina Theatre in Lowestoft came to do activities with us about their upcoming production all about the historic floods of Lowestoft.

As you will already be aware, we are a nut-free school - we have children who have allergies to a variety of different nuts as well as peanuts—and ask that parents check the ingredients of items in packed lunches, avoiding anything that states it contains nuts.



Reading



Children who 'choose' to read do better at school; there is lots of evidence for this. There is also evidence that shows children who read for pleasure have higher self esteem and a greater ability to cope with difficult situations. This is why we value reading so much at our school and think it is important for all children to read.

If your child is a reluctant reader it can be difficult to encourage them to read.

Here are some things that may help:

Advice for encouraging children to read at home

 Give your children access to as many styles of books as you can-fiction, non-fiction, furny, serious

 Buying books is expensive (especially if your child then isn't interested in the book)-use the library (at school and the town library), also try swapping books and passing on books to others.

 Visit the library and books shops often-give your child the freedom to choose for themselves.

· Lower the stakes-let them know it is ok to stop reading a book if it hasn't 'hooked them'

Avoid pushing them to read challenging books all of the time-let them read old favourites
or re-read books, even if they are for 'younger children' it can be comforting and fun

 Try reading aloud to your child-even if they are capable of reading the text themselves or even if they are an older child





support we offer at each level.



Tier I/ Wave I

This is the offer to all students. This includes:

- Quality First Teaching from Teachers and Teaching Assistants.
- · A carefully planned curriculum adapted to meet the needs of learners.
- After-school clubs and Breakfast club.
- Access to computer learning programmes.
- Varied opportunities for enrichment activities, trips and visitors.

Tier 2/ Wave 2

This is the support offered at the next level, where a child may need some targeted support.

At this level we offer:

Individual education plans - reviewed regularly.

Specific group work with small groups of children,

access to specific learning platforms or websites,
