
Our fantastic first half term together in Key Stage One has been topped off with our Halloween dress up day. Just look at some of our wonderful costumes.

Years 5 & 6



Years 1 & 2 mixed football




Both teams worked so hard and demonstrated brilliant teamwork & sportsmanship skills. We managed to secure 3rd & 4th place!


