In Key Stage I, we have had a fun filled last half term looking at the Greatest Inventions. We

started our learning by finding a plane wreckage where we needed to redesign a plane with guidance from the Wright brothers' old plans.






In Design Technology, we tried a range of vegetables to make our very own vegetable kebabs for a healthy snack. They were very tasty.

In Science, we have been looking at groups of animals and their diets. We explored the teeth structure of carnivores, herbivores and omnivores and made our own jaw models using sweets to represent teeth.





We thoroughly enjoyed our fete day where we got the chance to bounce to our hearts content on the amazing bouncy castles, enjoyed party games and took part in woodland crafts, all thanks to our PTFA!

<u>Years 3 & 4</u>

This half term, Lower Key Stage 2 have studied the Romans. Our topic began with a Roman Day with all of the children taking part in Roman activities, such as making shields, mosaics, coins and wreaths. This really immersed us in the History.





We had the Time and Tide Museum pay us a visit from Lady Livia and an Iceni warrior. This helped us to understand what happened when the Romans grew their empire.

Year 4 were lucky enough to be invited to Red Oak for Medical Mavericks. It was an opportunity to look at careers that are available in Science. We looked at Sports Science and Medical Science and had a great hands-on experience. We were very proud of the children's behaviour.









It was fantastic to have a Roman dance experience come in to visit us also. We were really proud of the children's creativity in these sessions and the final pieces they produced.

<u>Years 5 & 6</u>

What a wonderful final half term it has been in Years 5 and 6! It has been full of great learning, enrichment opportunities and lots of fun.

<u>Westwood CSI</u>

In our Science learning, the pupils became forensic scientists. They found out what a forensic scientist does and why their job is so important. As part of their learning, they dusted for fingerprints, explored the prints and discovered the subtle differences between each set of prints.

D.T. Fairgrounds

As designers, the children investigated a range of fairground rides, observed how they moved and identified the rotating parts. Next, they sketched a plan for their own fairground ride and created it. Once the structure was built, they included an electrical circuit with a motor to make the ride move. Finally, they evaluated their own and others' designs.

Roman Dance Workshop

We had a brilliant workshop with Lorraine from Multicultural Dance based on the Romans, as part of our



History unit. The pupils embraced the session and developed their own ancient Roman dances based on an image from Pompeii. They

really impressed with their interpretations and collaboration.
