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Nursery

Nursery have been using our new cameras this term, they have been helping each other explore how to use them. The Nursery have had a visit from 'Supertato and the Evil Pea', to go alongside our Talk For Writing theme this term. We have learnt to retell this story by learning some actions. The Pre-School has helped the Gruffalo this term, as he lost his friends from the story. The children went on a hunt around the school and managed to reunite them all, they then used the characters to retell some key phrases from the book. A huge thank you to all families that attended our Family Café this month, the child really love to share their learning with you!

Reception

The Reception class have had a fantastic half term filled with lots of exciting learning. In Maths the children have explored both adding and subtracting through a number of various maths challenges and inputs.

Our Talk 4 Writing space hook this half term, produced some super writing from the children and ignited an interest in the wider world for some.

The children have continued their creative flare in the deconstructed area with brilliant weekly creations from a volcano, vets surgery to a greengrocers to name just a few. We have also introduced Group Reading this half term, which has seen the children develop their love for stories and reading further. And also a big thank-you to our parent helpers who support our Reception children with their reading on a weekly basis. The Reception children also enjoyed a superhero training day as their reading tube treat, what fantastic costumes!

Our family café was another success continuing the children's interests of superheroes. The Reception children are growing and learning so much, we look forward to seeing what next term has to offer!

Year 1

Year I have been really excited about their topic: The Polar Regions. The children have used atlases and globes to locate Lowestoft and the Polar Regions, as well as finding out about polar animals, their habitats and how they survive. The children conducted a scientific experiment about Blubber, which was lots of fun. Also, the children have been busy learning poems, which they performed to their friends with confidence. Year I have now filled their second reading tube, so will be receiving a special treat! Big well done to all the children that read at home.

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Year 2

This half term has been very exciting as we have been exploring our new topic of "The Polar Regions" we have looked at where we live and located Lowestoft and local towns and cities on maps of the United Kingdom. Also, we have looked at Europe and the continents of the world. The children have enjoyed using maps and finding out where their peers have been on holiday. This half term, we have been taking part in lots of science experiments; one which let the children experience how blubber keeps animals warm in cold countries. The children tested this by putting their hands in cold icy water: with bare hands and with their hands covered in lard. They found out the lard acted like blubber and kept their hands warm. We are all very excited to become real scientists and take part in more exciting experiments.

<u>Year 3</u>

We have been working hard this half term in Year 3. In Literacy, the children have produced some excellent explanation texts about how to look after our class parrot, Petal. In Maths, we have learnt formal methods for subtraction and multiplication.

We have started our Australia topic and the children have learnt lots about the UK and Australia. Our map skills are improving and the children are enjoying comparing the two countries. The highlight of half term was our trip to Sizewell, as part of our electricity topic in science. The children learnt about how electricity is made and we practised fair tests with jelly and chopsticks. Thank you to the PTFA who funded the trip.

Year 4

Year 4 have had a fantastic half term learning all about Australia. We have taken part in bush tucker trials, interpreted a range of maps such as climatic, political and physical maps. We have discussed and compared the similarities and differences between Australia and the United Kingdom. We have really enjoyed exploring Australia and we will soon be looking at the Great Barrier Reef's ecosystem. In Science, we have performed an investigation to discover the impact of sugar, plaque and acid on our teeth. Through our investigation we were able to find out that sugar and plaque make acid. We tested how this acid attacks the enamel on our teeth by performing an experiment. We will now be learning how to look after our teeth and investigating how toothpaste protects our teeth.

Year 5 & 6

This half-term Years 5 and 6 have started their exciting new topic - China. We have been developing our map skills, looking at compass points and grid references and are now looking at specific cities within China, ready to compare them to life in Lowestoft. In Literacy, we have been focusing on the darkly brilliant fairy tale, Hansel and Gretel. We have taken inspiration from the text to create our own spooky settings and begun to look at characterisation to improve our own writing.
