The hall was packed full of invited guests including family members, representatives from the local high schools, members of our local community including residents of the nearby residential homes and day centres as well as a reporter from the Lowestoft Journal. The children led the two sessions and showcased all of their learning from this half term's enquiry, 'On the Move', with science investigations, model making demonstrations, games and even a Bush Tucker trial! Thank you to everyone who came, look out for the date of the next one!

We didn't let the snow stop us celebrating World Book Day with our annual costume parade and celebration lunch. This year, the children shared stories with friends in other classes and it was lovely to see our oldest children working alongside our youngest to read together. Thank you for your support, the children looked fantastic!

We also celebrated Sport Relief and raised  $\pounds 118$  for charity – the children & staff enjoyed dressing in sports kits and as their favourite sports personalities all while raising money for a good cause.

The children have enjoyed lots of new experiences this half term, many of which were the rewards for the children filling their Reading Challenge tubes. These have included gymnastics sessions at Waveney Gymnastics, cricket sessions with Coach Peggy, rugby with coaches from Lowestoft & Yarmouth RFC, a performance by the Philharmonic Orchestra, British Science Week at Adastral Park, a Robot themed Science Day, a Harry Potter themed Writing Day, We Will Rock You, Africa Alive, and an inter-school Spelling Bee...

Once again, we had lots of people join us for our Woodland School family sessions which saw 100 trees being planted in our woods and our new allotment area cleared, as well as Bush Tucker trials and the hanging of the bird boxes the children have built. 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
Reading at Home

# Spring Term

#### Nursery

The nursery children have had a busy term, they have almost filled their 3rd reading tube and recently enjoyed a visit to Africa Alive. We went on a treasure hunt around the school following clues as a reveal for our trip. They experienced holding and touching a Millipede, Sylvester the snake and Willy Wonka the African Land Snail. We learned about different habitats and found animals that are taller and shorter than us. We have also had a focus on height within the classroom measuring with rulers and a height chart.



## <u>Year | & Year 2</u>

This half term has been very exciting in Key Stage I, the children particularly enjoyed welcoming you to their transport learning museum. This was a great opportunity for the children to showcase what they have learnt and where their learning is heading next. Both classes have enjoyed their reading reward, Year I had a session at Waveney Gymnastics club while Year 2 enjoyed a movie and pizza afternoon. ## Reception

Reception have had a very busy half term. We developed our role play area into a vets and have had a number of animals come to visit. It has been lots of fun finding out how to look after each one. To support our learning about the effect of exercise on our bodies and ways to stay healthy, we visited Waveney Gymnastics for a fun session where we had a go on all the different pieces of apparatus. Lots of new things have appeared in our classroom including a tinkering table where we can develop our fine motor skills by using screwdrivers to take things apart - at the moment we are working on an old computer! We have also started using a computer programme called Mini Mash and have individual challenges to complete each week. Our writing area now includes a challenge with questions for us to think about to help us choose what to write, such a giant set of keys and a whole range of funny hats! Our class has doubled in size thanks to the arrival of our Mini Mes, these are small versions of ourselves that we can play with and use in our small world scenes. We have been working towards our Woodland Worker awards in Woodland School and have been learning the story 'Zog' in our Talk 4 Writing sessions. Happy Easter to our families!

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## <u>Year 3 & Year 4</u>

This term has been really exciting for Year 3. The children have loved their enquiry topic about explorers and have demonstrated their excellent geography and history skills. The children have also learnt how to note take, undertake research and how present their work using a computer. The children researched famous explorers such as Captain James Cook, Scott of the Antarctic and Christopher Columbus. After this, they were inspired to plan their own expeditions. Some of the children from Year 3 chose to plan an expedition to the Wet Tropics of Queensland, as Captain Cook explored Australia, whilst the other children planned an expedition to Mount Kilimanjaro. In Year 4, the children researched their destination, chose the appropriate equipment to take and were able to find out the total travel costs. It was great to see how enthusiastic the children were throughout this enquiry topic. All of the exciting work produced was displayed in the Westwood Museum. Year 3 and 4 were so proud and excited to present all of their wonderful work and share their knowledge with all the parents. We would like to thank all the parents and families who supported the event and we cannot wait to begin our next enquiry topic.

#### <u>Year 5</u>

What a fun half term Year 5 have had! We have worked really hard at improving our writing, using pictures to encourage our descriptive language, and have been incredibly successful at doing so. Multiplication has been the main area of maths we have focused on. Year 5 are now much more confident at using the column method, completing multiplication challenges and multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000. We have been incredibly fortunate to have rugby coaches coming in each week. The children have loved these sessions. Working as a team, learning how to tackle correctly and safely and getting downright muddy! All of these things have been fantastic fun and we feel very lucky to have taken part in these sessions. Year 5, along with year 6, also had the pleasure of welcoming in the Seagull Theatre. Acting is something that so many of the children enjoy, so to be able to work together and act out lines, play games and sing and dance was great fun! We're now looking forward to all of the exciting things coming in the summer term.

## <u>Year 6</u>

Well what a busy spring term this has been. Our On the Move Museum was a huge success, the children thoroughly enjoyed sharing their knowledge and understanding of transport with members of the community and were delighted that residents from local care homes came to visit too. Our bird boxes are completed and we will be hanging them in the woods after Easter (a huge thank you to the parents who came to support this project). We were blown away by the Philharmonic Orchestra last week and work has started on our summer production!

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## Junior Road Safety

Our JRSOs were visited by Norman Drew, the local PCSO. He showed them how to use the speed gun outside the school to see how fast the cars were going. The JRSOs found it very interesting and learnt a lot from Norman's visit. Please remember not to park on the zigzag lines outside of the school as this could cost you a child's life and a £30 fine.

A big well done to the mixed Year 3 team that took part in a Skittleball Tournament at East Point Academy on Wednesday 14th March. All children behaved really well. ## <u>School Council</u>

The School Council met earlier this half term to discuss how Westwood were going to show support for Sport Relief. We decided that each class would spend 10 minutes every day walking and counting their steps.
