<u>Sea Shanties</u>

Wow! What a start to the school year! We were joined by some talented artist from Voice Cloud for two full days learning to sing and perform Sea Shanties.

Each class were given the opportunities to watch and perform alongside the artists as well as learn about the history of Sea Shanties and the fishing industry in Lowestoft.

These sessions have inspired the children to enquire in more depth about the history of fishing in Lowestoft. Children in Year 3 and Year 4 visited the Time



and Tide Museum in Great Yarmouth and children in Year 5 and Year 6 visited the Maritime Museum in Lowestoft. Back in school, they are now split in to enquiry teams investigating the bits they found the most interesting.

This project has launched the start of a change to the curriculum at Westwood. Children will be leading their own enquiries relating to topics of interest to them. History, Geography, Science, DT, Art etc. will be incorporated into the enquiries to ensure they

still receive the important learning aspects from the national curriculum and literacy and maths will be taught both discretely and as part of the enquiry.

More about these changes to learning will be shared with you soon.



Attendance

Attendance this year has been much improved. The attendance figure for 2016/2017 is 95.6%. The national expectation is 96%.

Thank you so much for supporting your child and our school. However, please do not give up.

Each week we publish the amount of lost learning hours and display it in the front office. Some weeks the number of lost learning hours is shockingly high! That means that some of our children are missing out on learning which is seriously



affecting their progress and attainment. As we know, some children are missing big chunks of learning and may never catch up!

The other serious issue for our school is punctuality. A small number of children are late every day or a few times a week. Again this means that the children are missing out. For example, in some classes children are taught to read from 8.45am and if your child is late, they are missing their reading session. If they are late everyday, they are missing their reading session everyday.

We are rewarding good attendance and good punctuality in various ways including a forthcoming Assembly for parents to attend as well as a Class Breakfast with the teachers! Year 6 and Year 3 have enjoyed breakfast so far!

We need your support! Attendance and Punctuality figures can count against the school and we do not want to be judged as a poor school because we have children arriving late for school.

Parental Involvement

Parental involvement in learning is essential. We will be holding lots of events in school and sending activities home for you to enjoy with your child. We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible. Look out for the flyers coming home from school outlining the date of the events.

We have an 'open door policy' here at Westwood and welcome parents to come into school to discuss any concerns, share information and celebrate your child's success on a daily basis. Teachers are available at the beginning and end of the school day to talk with parents and carers; generally the end of the school day is better. The headteacher is also available on a day to day basis, without the need to make an appointment.

We have begun by using the internet, inviting quest visitors into school and enjoyed a trip to Lowestoft Museum. So far we have some fantastic questions and are really excited to find out the answers. We look forward to sharing our amazing learning with you and keeping you updated on our progress.

To launch our first enquiry, 'Lowestoft and the Sea', we spent a day exploring the Maritime Museum and coastline from Sparrow's Nest to Ness Point. As if that wasn't exciting enough, we then enjoyed two days of workshops with the Voice Cloud, learning about the history of sea shanties and even performing a few to our friends and families. In class, we have developed our enquiry questions around areas which interest us: fishing, boats, lighthouses, flooding, Lowestoft during the war and seas/beaches. Now we begin the most important task: deciding how to gather the information about these topics we need to enable us to present our findings to others. We are really enjoying working together across the two classes as it gives us the chance to work with different people and develop our learning behaviours, particularly how to build new relationships and take risks.


