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#### Nursery

In nursery we have had a busy few weeks learning all about the story 'The very hungry caterpillar'. We can now retell the story. Please have a look at our wonderful story maps. #### <u>Year 2</u>

Year 2 have had a busy half term. The children thoroughly enjoyed sharing their castle topic with parents at the recent family cafe - a huge thank you to all of the families that attended. The children recently made traps in the woods to catch mythical beasts. From their designs the children then wrote super instructions on how to make their traps! In maths the children have been focusing on written methods for each calculation. They have all made super progress. Habitats is our current topic and the children are making the most of our stunning outside area.

**Reception** The reception children have been very busy again this month. They have enjoyed retelling the story of 'The very hungry caterpillar' by Eric Carle.

The children have enjoyed watching the life cycle of a caterpillar and making a habitat suitable for our butterfly farm. We have painted beautiful pasta butterflies to celebrate our butterflies emerging from their cocoon.

Reception children were exceptionally well behaved on their school trip to Ringsfield where they enjoyed exploring the story of 'We're going on a bear hunt' through nature. The children also made clay bugs to bring home.

The reception children have been very busy practising for sports day and have enjoyed working in a team and cheering on their friends.

#### <u>Year I</u>

Year I have really enjoyed creating watercolour masterpieces inspired by Georgia O'Keeffe and Da Vinci. The children learnt a range of techniques including sketching, outlining and different paint strokes. As well as this the children have enjoyed playing rounder's and have progressed from using a tennis racket to a real rounder's bat! Super visible progress, well done Year I. We have also recently won the attendance award three times so will be receiving a delicious breakfast very soon. Keep up the good work and keep reading at home.



#### <u>Year 3</u>

Year 3 went on a fantastic trip to Sizewell where they took part in lots of science based activities. They learnt about electricity and friction as well as how energy is produced at the power plant. It was great to see the children so engaged and showing their best Westwood manners. In addition, we were lucky enough to visit Norwich Theatre where we watched a brilliant production of Fantastic Mr Fox. It was a great day which included lots of laughter and smiles.





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#### <u>Year 4</u>

Over the past 6 weeks, the Year 4 children have received specialist cricket coaching. Each week our coach Peggy has taught many different catching, fielding and batting techniques and how to apply these to a game. Year 4 had mastered many of these skills and were feeling secretly confident so they challenged Year 5 to a cricket match. It was a hard fought

battle but in the end Year 4 come out as the winners! It was an excellent demonstration of their learning and once again, fantastic sportsmanship shown from both sides.



#### <u>Year 5 & Year 6</u>

On Tuesday 23rd May, Years 5 & 6 spent the day at Benacre Farm & Estate. In total, we took part in 10 activities as well as watching a Farm Machinery Display. During the morning, we were at the coastal site, where we dissected owl pellets to find and identify the animals they had eaten. We also learned about some of the creatures in our seas and how to train a dog. After a picnic lunch, we spent the afternoon at Wood Farm Barn where we listened to a talk about birds of prey, went on a bug hunt and learned how sugar is made. All of the children behaved beautifully and made the most of every opportunity throughout the day - it has even sparked an interest in nature and the great outdoors for some!
