John Kirk travels up and down the country bringing stories to life through drama and on Wednesday 26th April, we were lucky enough to have him visit our school.



He started the day with Reception, Year 1 & Year 2, where he shared some traditional tales.

Then he spent some time with Year 3, telling stories based on the Roman era.

After play, Year 4 enjoyed a range of Greek myths.

In the afternoon, Year 5 were treated to tales of time travel and Space exploration.





The final workshop of the day was with Year 6, where they got to grips with some of Shakespeare's work.

Each workshop was action packed and full of fun – all the children (and staff) loved his visit and we can't wait to see him again soon!

Some of our Reception children have invited their family members and people from the community to come in and share their favourite story with the class.

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Nursery

We have been very busy in nursery learning all about 2d shapes and retelling our story 'Dear Zoo'. We have been developing our outside area with the children making dens, obstacle courses and stepping stones. We look forward to the weather improving so we can enjoy learning in these areas.

<u>Year 2</u>

Miss Read has joined the year 2 teaching team and she has already made some significant changes to the learning environment. The children are very enthusiastic about their new learning space and already they have been using it during maths and literacy. Year 2 have had a very exciting start to the term! The Beast visited the classroom and he made a terrible mess, he left a letter for the children explaining why he got turned into a Beast. The children will be using the story of Beauty and the Beast to create their own tales of fear. The year 2 children have been trying really hard to read at home every night we have gone from only 9 children reading to 23 children reading at home!!!

Reception

The Reception children have had another fantastic month. The children have explored their creative writing skills through talk for writing, by changing the story of ZOG by Julia Donaldson to make it their very own version. What exciting things ZOG has learned to do at dragon school!!!! In Maths, the reception children have been learning to count in 10's and exploring, estimation, repeating patterns and time, which is also our new focus for our Maths station. The children eagerly carried out an investigation about floating and sinking and made sound predictions about what may happen. The new campsite role play area, has been a huge success with children pretending to fall asleep under the stars and toast marshmallows. What Fun!!



<u>Year</u> I

Year I have had a super start to the Summer term. We thoroughly enjoyed our trip to see The First Hippo on The Moon and the children were amazing representatives of Westwood. The children have explored creating a simple algorithm to move the Bee Bot around a road that they had built. Their roads included bridges, tunnels and turns which made it even trickier! The children showed resilience as they used trial and error when entering their algorithms. We have already seen some brilliant examples of the Summer homework and we look forward to seeing much more!



<u>Year 3 & Year 4</u>

Year 3 and 4 had a fantastic trip to Trinity Park in Ipswich to take part in a variety of agricultural activities, watching animal shows and even looking at an air ambulance and tractors. We really enjoyed a fascinating show about carrots and how they are grown as well as sheep shearing and a tractor ride. The children all showed their Westwood manners and were very well behaved throughout the whole trip.

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<u>Year 5</u>

We spent an afternoon at The Marina Theatre showcasing both our clarinet and singing talents as we performed with The Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment and other schools from the local area. In class, we started our new Topic, The Victorians, by singing along to the musical, Oliver! The children will be leading their learning in this subject and have already thought up lots of questions they want to find the answers to. We will be linking our learning to our Literacy where we will write Instructions and an Explanation Text with a Victorian theme. We also put our detective skills to the test when we completed an archaeological dig in our classroom with a bit of help from Access Cambridge Archaeology. We will be developing these skills further in our Maths lessons, where we will be applying our learning in order to solve mysteries.

<u>Year 6</u>

Year 6 have been incredibly busy this month: we have had a visiting storyteller retelling Shakespeare plays to us; archaeologists from the university of Cambridge visit and we have been working hard preparing for our SATs tests next week. We soon begin our transition work with high schools which will include: rocket making at Pakefield High School, a French play at Grove with other local primary schools and assemblies with high school ambassadors. We only have half a tube left until we reach our ninth full tube so keep reading everyone!
