<u>Year 2</u>

Year 2 have had a busy few weeks of learning. We have been writing stories about a journey inspired by the story 'Where the Wild Things Are' and doubling and halving 2 digit numbers. Mrs Hurren has been so impressed with the quality of the work super work Year 2! We have also been about our local area, including Lowestoft in the past and wider afield.

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Reception

We have been learning the new phonemes j, N, M, Z, Y and QU and have been practising these in our writing. In maths we have been learning about 3D shapes, recognising and describing their properties. We have been recognising numerals and matching quantity to number.

In Talk for Writing we have been learning the story 'The Three Little Pigs' and can retell the story well with actions. We have used a hand saw to cut pieces of wood for the little pigs house!

Exciting news... Reception have won a breakfast for great attendance and we only have half a reading tube to fill until we get to have a trip out!

<u>Year 3</u>

We have been working hard learning all about 'Aboriginal Art' designing and painting our own designs. They have enjoyed using dot's as a way of decorating their designs and finding out where the patterns originated. Please come in and see out great artwork!

<u>Year I</u>

Year I have had a busy start to the Spring term. We have been learning about Goldilocks and the Three Bears. The children have been busy planning and building houses for the Three Bears as well as making a boat for Goldilocks. In maths we have been learning to use the taking away strategy to subtract. Sneaky Captain Blackbeard stole treasure from Long John Silver. The children had to work out how many pieces of treasure Blackbeard had taken by using the taking away strategy.



<u>Year 4</u>

Year 4 have kicked off their new topic of India with a fantastic Bollywood dance lesson. We learnt lots about the Bollywood movie industry and the importance of dance and music. The afternoon was spent perfecting our dance moves and performing as a class in beautiful saris and waistcoats. We all had lots of fun!



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Year 5

Year 5 started the new year by reflecting on 2016 and setting ourselves personal challenges for 2017, some children want to earn their pen licence, others want to improve things like spellings or their clarinet skills and I'm pleased to say many of them are well on their way to achieving their resolution already! Just before Christmas, we filled our 3rd reading tube and have earned a class reward. The details are top secret at the moment while we make the final arrangements but I am certain they are going to love it!

We have introduced our Book Bingo so the children can earn themselves individual prizes too!

We have been really busy in class mastering column addition and subtraction, writing balanced arguments and learning about China. We have continued our clarinet lessons.

(we can now play 5 different notes!) and have entered our artwork into a painting competition.



<u>Year 6</u>

Well what a busy half term it has been so far! Year 6 recently visited East Coast Cinema to watch Fantastic Beasts as their reading challenge treat. This has inspired them to write reports about their own creatures! We also recently attended an indoor athletics tournament where the children had the opportunity to compete against 25 other schools. In maths the children have been looking at negative numbers in context and in topic we have been researching European cities.
