Nursery & Reception Spring I



<u>Nursery</u>

The Nursery children have enjoyed a successful half term exploring the topic of 'Feelings' we have looked at different feelings, how to recognize them, communicate them share them through a range of story books. In Maths we have had a strong number focus and we are become very good at recognising an amount 1–5 without counting.

We have introduced the children to our nursery string, which sees the children learning a new nursery rhyme each week, so far we have learnt Twinkle Twinkle Little Star, Row Row Row your Boat, Incy Wincy Spider and Hickory Dickory Dock.

We have had a particular focus on name writing this half term and lots of the children are becoming confident in this area.

In the provision the children have enjoyed lots of different sensory play and team work, we have been working hard on turn taking and sharing too. The children have been enjoying our transient art table where they create a picture from lots of different loose parts. They are very creative, we love them!

We have enjoyed some yoga and breathing exercises this half term too. I am sure they would love to show you.

<u>Reception</u>

This term Reception have been taking part in the topic '3, 2, I Blast Off', where they have been learning about space. The children were excited to discover a space rocket crash landing site and a friendly alien called Zaip, The children helped teach Zaip about planet Earth and what there was to do on our planet. Throughout the topic the children have created their own non-fiction books creating fact files using their phonic knowledge to write simple sentences about the different planets Zaip had visited. We have explored the famous composer Gustav Holst listening to his music 'The Planets' the children used instruments, practised being a composer and created their own piece of music about Earth using body percussion and their voices. Last week we enjoyed taking part in science experiments finding out how gravity works and how craters on the moon are created. In Maths this term we built on our previous knowledge of 2D shapes exploring the artists Mondiran and Jennifer Teo and looked at the characteristics of 3D shapes. We have been learning about ordinal numbers and identifying one less than and one more than.





Nursery & Reception Spring 2



Nursery

In Spring 2 our topic will be Eggs. We will be exploring different types of eggs and experimenting in the provision. We will start ELS phonics with a sound a week and activities the sound will be sent home for you to share. In maths we will continue to explore pattern and also capacity

We will be having a parent share week w/c 11th March, we hope to see you there!

<u>Reception</u>

In Spring 2 our topic will be What's on your plate?

We will be walking to the local shop to buy ingredients, writing shopping lists, recipes preparing and making food. We will be exploring food from around the world ending with a Teddy Bears Picnic (which will be a surprise until next half term) which we would like to invite you to on the last day of term.

For science week we will be having a special assembly and will be inviting you in for a stay and play session.

In maths we will be exploring pattern, shape and sequencing.



Years 1 & 2 Spring 1



.This half term, we have been learning all about the Great Fire of London. We have had so much fun with a visit from the local fire officers to put out our recreation of the fire. We have enjoyed developing our team work and ball skills in PE.

Years 1 & 2 Spring 2



Next half term we will be learning all about

Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole

As Writers, we will be writing a non chronological report on the life of Mary Seacole..

As **Readers**, we will be continuing to develop our fluency skills as well using information we retrieve from texts to answer questions.

As Mathematicians, we will be exploring fractions and time.

As Scientists, we investigating what plants need to grow.

As Historians, we will be researching the life of both Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole and why they are remembered figures today.

As Musicians, we will be identify a range of sounds related to instruments.

As Design Technologists, we will be exploring wheels and axles to make a moving vehicle..

As Athletes, we will be creating different movement sequences in Gymnastics.

As Computing Experts, we will be creating algorithms to move a beebot.

During **Religion and World Views**, we will be learning all about how Christians belong to their family faith.



Years 3 & 4 Spring 1



We have had a fabulous term in Year 3 and 4. We have been super busy and the children have worked very hard.

In Art, we have learned about the artist Wassily Kadinsky and explored his abstract art. We looked at the features of his work and discussed what we liked and didn't like about it. This then inspired us to create our own design of abstract work using shapes and colours.

Then we made a 3d bowl out of paper mache. This was great fun! To make our bowls even better we copied our art work onto the bowls and added shapes and texture. Once dry we painted it using bright and bold colours. They look amazing.











During the term we also had a wonderful morning making some bread. This was brilliant and smelled delicious. We had to knead the bread first to activate the yeast and then we manipulated our dough into our chosen shapes.

Geography saw us learning all about why the climate is important. We started by finding out what is the difference between weather and climate and then went on to learn about what a climate zone is. Finally, we looked at some of the different biomes and how the climate effects these. We displayed our findings by creating mini biomes and fact files.







Years 3 & 4 Spring 2



English

This half term we will be writing our own story from a different point of view. We will be using the text Stone Age Boy to support us with this. Our focus will be adverbial clauses, noun phrases, personification, paragraphs and varying sentence types...

<u>Maths</u>

In maths the children will be completing their units on fractions. Year 4 will move on to looking at decimals and year 3 will focus on mass and capacity.

Computing-Repetition in games

In this unit the children will practice using loops in a game on the programme scratch. They will learn to animate their name by choosing an action that will be repeated. The final outcome of this unit will be to design and create a game using all of our prior learning.

DT

The children will have the opportunity to create a nightlight by investigating and creating a simple circuit with a switch. They will understand how a simple circuit is made and electrical systems.

<u>Science – Rocks</u>

The children will have the opportunity to compare and group together different kinds of rocks. They will exploring their appearance and simple physical properties and describing how fossils are formed.

History- The Stone Age

In this unit the children will be investigating what was new about the New Stone Age. Children will understand the Stone Age and its different periods. They will use evidence to understand what life was like in the old and middle Stone Ages and investigate what life was like in the Mesolithic settlement.

Religion and World Views

In this unit the children will be looking at sacrifice. They will be answering the units Big Question— What does sacrifice mean? They will be discussing Why Muslims fast? Discussing if Easter is a festival of sacrifice or new life? And exploring the beliefs and practices of Humanists.



Years 5 & 6 Spring 1

Another excellent term! Year 5 and 6 worked extremely hard and created some wonderful learning outcomes in the build up to half term. Here are some of our highlights:

In Literacy, the pupils were given the opportunity to research someone who was inspirational to them. Some children chose to interview family friends or relatives whilst others researched their chosen person online.


After collating their research together, pupils drafted their Biographies, carefully considering how to implement all of our steps to success in the process. We published our final outcomes on laptops or on double page spreads in our books—look at our

fantastic display!











In Science we developed our knowledge of how Electricity to transported in closed circuits. We investigated how the function of different components changes when the voltage supplied to the circuit is increased or decreased.

In Art, we were inspired by the work of Alberto Giacometti. After identifying the key features of his art style, the children designed, created and evaluated their own models inspired by his work.









Years 5 & 6 Spring 2



As readers we will be reading, enjoying and discussing our novels in our whole class reading sessions. We will also be reading non-fiction, songs and poetry.

As mathematicians we will be learning about decimals, percentages, area and perimeter and Statistics. We will answer variety of fluency, reasoning and problem solving questions in all of these topics!

As geographers we will be answering our big question—'What is life like in the Amazon?' To do so, we will locate the Amazon on maps, use research to identify the climate and weather conditions that exist there and use research to identify how the Amazon has changed over time.

In Music we will develop our rhythm and coordination when creating rhythmic dances.

In RWV we will be discussing the theories behind the world's creation— creation by God or evolution by Science.

Reminders

As writers we will be writing suspenseful narratives based on the video clip titled 'Francis'. This work will be inspired by the book 'Water Tower' by Gary Crew:

As scientists we will be learning about Living Things and their Habitats. In particular, we will consider the differences and similarities that exist between the life cycles of humans, amphibians, insects and birds, as well as the life processes and reproduction of some animals and plants.

In Design Technology we will design and create a toy car powered by pulleys and gears.

Homework

Well done to all of the children who handed in outstanding homework last term. We would love to see this continue in Spring 2. Remember to check out our homework menu to see what you could do to impress your teachers next term!

Please make sure your child has their PE and woodland kit in school all week. Our uniform policy is a white top, black bottoms and appropriate footwear.


ATTENDANCE.


