capacity is the size of a container and the volume it holds inside.

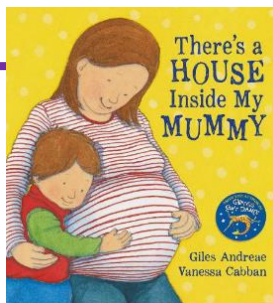
